The sound and three channel video installation **POEM OF A CELL** opens the wings of a triptych of love and ecstasy. **POEM OF A CELL** fascinates through its amalgamations of sound art with three imaginative films that run simultaneously on three screens. This deliriously beautiful cinepoetry amazes thanks to the might of the film images, shot in one take, the exceptional camerawork and the boundary-crossing composition of sounds. The three screens act like living paintings coexisting side by side with the tremendous narrative power of noise, silence, music and the magic of soundscapes.

POEM OF A CELL is a 138-minutes sound and film sequence about the sensual longing love poems **Song of Songs** from the Tanakh, **The flowing Light of the Godhead** by Mechthild of Magdeburg and **Unity with the Divine** by Rabi'a of Basra. All three poems are based on the unifying theme that brings Judaism, Christianity and Islam together and bridges all their differences: love, ecstasy and, ultimately, the unification with the divine love.

The woman is at the heart of **POEM OF A CELL**. Past, present and future all occur simultaneously.

POEM OF A CELL does not tell a coherent story, but awakens memories using the narrative power of sound, noise and image. It is about desire and spite, longing and disgust, violence and lenity, destruction and salvation, separation and unification, innocence and guilt, permission and suppression, woman and man. In **POEM OF A CELL** reality and fantasy merge seamlessly. It is a stunning journey into the life of mankind.

STEFAN WINTER

Sound-, Object- and Video Art, Music Production
born January 26th, 1958, Tegernsee, Germany

Autodidact Winter created and produced music, noises, soundscapes and video since the early 1980s. He directed the recordings for the labels JMT [Jazz Music Today] and Bamboo [based in Tokyo, Japan] from 1985 through 1995. Together with Mariko Takahashi he founded Winter & Winter after 1995. For this multidisciplinary music label he developed the AudioFilm [the magazine Spiegel titled: Cinema for closed eyes]. Winter turned music-, sound-, and noise-recordings into one work of art. Winter & Winter has amassed numerous awards including the annual German Record Critics' Prize, Edison Award [Holland], Gramophone Award [Great Britain], Diapason d'or [France], Académie Charles-Cros [France]. Winter was honored with the annual prize German Record Critics' Prize and the Schwabinger Kunstpreis [art award Schwabing] from the Cultural department of the Munich Town council [Germany].

Music productions with Hans Abrahamsen, Teodoro Anzellotti, Irvine Arditti, Jim Black, Theo Bleckmann, Uri Caine, Stefano Gervasoni, Forma Antiqua, Mauricio Kagel, Paul Motian, Schoenberg Ensemble, Barbara Sukowa, Ernst Reijseger, Fumio Yasuda and others. Since 1985 Winter produced over 300 music and sound recordings including „Blue Skies“ by Cassandra Wilson, the AudioFilm „Venezia la Festa“, „Urlicht“ after Gustav Mahler and „Wagner e Venezia“ by Uri Caine, film scores and soundtracks with Ernst Reijseger for Werner Herzog and Alex & Andrew Smith, „Let me tell you“ by Hans Abrahamsen with Barbara Hannigan, „On Broadway“ by Paul Motian, „Rien“ by Noël Akchoté, Vivaldi's „Le quattro stagioni“ by Aarón Zapico and Forma Antiqua, all Schubert Trios with La Gaia Scienza, „The Goldberg Variations“ with Teodoro Anzellotti, as well as „Nightlife - Sounds of the City“, 10 short soundscapes about the great metropolitan cities of the world.
